CEEV and WSTA notice on Incoterms following Brexit

Incoterms are the selling terms that the buyer and seller of goods both agree to during international transactions. The Incoterms rules feature abbreviations for terms, like FOB ("Free on Board"), DAP ("Delivered at Place") EXW ("Ex Works"), CIP ("Carriage and Insurance Paid To"), which all have very precise meanings for the sale of goods around the world.

Understanding Incoterms is a vital part of International Trade because they clearly state which tasks, costs and risks are associated with the buyer and the seller. See the schema on the next page.

UK will become a third country market as from 01 January 2021; the export procedure will inevitably become more costly and burdensome. As part of the Brexit preparations, CEEV and WSTA would like to advise EU wineries and UK importers to jointly check down the entire supply chain and to decide whether the incoterms need to be changed after Brexit, depending on the cost and risk that each party is ready to assume. Every participant in the specific supply chain must understand the terms of their contract and the extent to which standard incoterms may have been modified.

We restate that:

- Nothing in both EU and UK regulatory framework creates any obligation that would promote a specific incoterm or deprive trade partners from using another;
- Incoterms are a purely commercial agreement between the parties and as such, parties have to decide by mutual agreement which incoterm they want to use.
